Logging In

- 1. Go to the Edmentum login page. https://login.edmentum.com/
- 2. Enter your Account Login, User Name, and Password, and select the **Log in to Edmentum** button.

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Diagnostics

Exact Path works by creating a learning path of activities that are tailored just for you. It's the **diagnostic test** that helps to decide what should go into each of your learning paths.

The diagnostic test is not a typical pass-or-fail exam. Instead, the test determines what you already know about a subject and what you're ready to learn next. You don't get a grade for this test, and you're not expected to know all the answers to the questions.

If your teacher has scheduled a diagnostic test for you, it will automatically appear as a tile on your homepage.

Select the **Diagnostic tile** for a subject to begin your test.

In the next prompt, answer the question "Are you working in your school building?" Then select the **Continue** button.

You must answer each question. If you are not sure what the answer is, make your best guess. Select the Submit button to move onto the next question.

The **Reader Tools** area includes a highlighter function and a text resizer. It also includes a click-tospeak tool (if your teacher has enabled audio accommodations for you).

Once you have finished a test, the diagnostic tile will disappear, and a learning path tile will appear in its place.

Learning Paths

Learning paths in Exact Path are designed just for you. Within these learning paths, you will find activities to complete. You'll practice what you learn and improve your skills. You will have up to three learning paths, one for Language Arts, one for Reading, and one for Math.

Work on Your Learning Path

When you log in to your account, you'll be taken straight to your home page. This is where you'll find your learning paths.

Select a Learning Path tile to begin working on your learning path.

This an example of a skill on a **Reading** learning path. The section at the top tells you what skill you will be learning. Select the i button to learn more about the skill.

Select the **Play** button to begin the activity.

To unlock the progress check, complete all the activities that are available first.





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What Activities Look Like

Each activity will look a little different. Here are some examples.

Lessons

These teach you something new. Select the **Play** button to begin, then **read**, **watch** and **listen**. As you progress through the lesson, you'll answer some questions to check your understanding.

Use the menu on the left of the screen to access **helpful tools**. You'll find a highlighter, resources, a dictionary, reading tools, translators, and other useful things. They're designed to help you engage with your learning path in whichever way makes it the most understandable and memorable to you.



Practices

Practices ask you questions to help build upon your knowledge and test your understanding. **Follow the instructions**, as the question types vary and require you to interact in different ways.

Select the **reader tools button** at the top of your screen to open a tool bar with click to speak options, a highlighter and a dictionary. Select the **Submit** button to submit your answers.



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Progress Checks

Progress Checks are last. You are given questions about the skill you have been learning.

Select the Next button to submit your answer and see the next question.

Reader tools are available in progress checks too.

Score 80% or higher to earn a trophy! Then you can move on to the next skill in your learning path.

Navigating

Select Save & Exit to go back to your learning path whenever you need to. This will save all your work up to that point. That means you don't need to complete an activity in a single session.

Be sure to check if the slides have multiple parts. Use the orange arrows to navigate through all the parts of the content before you move to the next slide.



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My Rewards

For a quick view of the number of trophies you have earned during this school year, select any of your **learning paths** and see a trophy count towards the top of the screen.

You earn trophies by mastering skills. You earn badges by completing challenges set by your teacher.



You can find rewards in the My **Rewards** area. Rewards that you have earned and are in progress are shown here.

Note that the Latest Earned section may show trophies and badges that have been acquired during this school year and previous years.

Assignments

Assignments are activities that your teacher might give you in addition to your learning path. They are designed to deepen your knowledge of particular skills.

If you have an assignment, it will appear as a tile on your home page alongside your learning path tiles.

Assignment tiles have a **title** so you know what they are about, and an end date so that you can see when you need to complete them.

Select an assignment tile to start working on it.



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Messages

Select the **Messages** button to read notes or announcements from your teacher.

You can write a message to your teacher by selecting the **New Message** button.



Time on Task

To see how long you have been working on your learning paths this week, select the **Usage** icon from the menu.



The pop up tells you how much time you have spent in each of your subjects. It does not count how long you have spent completing diagnostic tests or Assignments.
